RULES

- 1. All Extravaganza events and programs are open to youth and adults, except the Jackpot shows, which are youth events.
- 2. Only Does and Wethers are eligible to be shown in the Showmanship and Jackpot Shows.
- 3. It is strongly recommended that all Jackpot Market goats be dehorned.
- 4. Animals are <u>not</u> required to be clipped. Clipping is allowed in <u>designated areas only</u>.
- 5. Water must be available to goats in their pens at all times.
- 6. Meshed or plastic muzzles may be used so long as they allow the animal to open their mouth and drink water.
- For security purposes buildings will be locked ½ hour after shows finish on Friday and Saturday nights. They will be open the following morning at 6 a.m.
- 8. Weld County Goat Extravaganza is not responsible for any losses or accidents.
- 9. **Registration deadline is April 13, 2012.** Late entries will be accepted with a late fee.
- 10. Stalling 6' x 6' pens are available to stall your animals. Initial bedding is not provided. Shavings and straw concessions provided. Exhibitors with smaller goats (especially young Pygmy goats) need to provide interior fencing or crates to keep goats from escaping pens.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All goats must be inspected by a show veterinarian before entering the barn. No animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds exhibiting symptoms of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases such as but not limited to: external abscesses, ringworm, pinkeye, and soremouth. It is recommended that goats be deloused two weeks prior to Extravaganza.
- 2. Health requirements for out-of-state exhibitors: Colorado law requires all out of state goats be accompanied by a valid health certificate. Health certificates will be examined at time of check in.
- 3. SCRAPIE: The USDA's Scrapie Eradication Program will be enforced at the Weld County Goat Extravaganza. All breeding goats; wethers 18 months & over; and all does shown as market goats must have scrapie ear tags. <u>Exception</u>: registered goats may use tattoos or microchips with breed registration numbers in place of scrapie ear tags. Registration papers must be provided for verification

Educational Seminars

Showmanship Clinics

Showmanship clinics provide instruction on showing and fitting for market, dairy, pygmy and fiber goat projects. Hands-on practice with members and their goats will take place in the Livestock Building. Check the schedule of events for times. Bring your animal and get some practical advice that will help you be successful in the show ring!

Quiz Bowl

Attention Youth! Test your goat knowledge by entering the Quiz Bowl which will be set up in the 4-H Building. You can take the quiz on your own time between 12 - 1:30 p.m. on Saturday. Prizes will be awarded to the top youth participant in each age division; under 8, 8-10, 11-13, and 14 & over. Winners will be announced on Saturday afternoon at the All Around Showmanship Contest.

Bedding

Wood shavings or straw may be used as bedding. The Briggsdale 4-H Washington Focus will have shavings for sale on site.

Jackpot Showmanship Contests

Youth exhibitors can test their skills in Jackpot Showmanship contests for market, dairy, pygmy, and fiber divisions. Divisions are: Pre-Junior (8-9 years old); Junior (10-11); Intermediate (12-14); and Senior (15-18). Entry is \$5/member. You can pre-enter on the registration form, or you can register at show time. Cash premiums will be awarded.

Pee Wee & Novice showmanship classes are also offered. There are no entry fees or premiums for these classes. They are intended to give young and first year members an opportunity to gain experience in the show ring. Ownership of the animal is not required for showmanship.

All Around Showmanship Contest

First and second place finishers in market, dairy, pygmy and fiber divisions will compete for Champion All Around Showman. All Around will be offered in the Pre-Junior, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior divisions.

Jackpot Prospect Market Goat Show

- 1. <u>This is a prospect show</u>. Animals must have milk teeth intact.
- 2. Goats will be weighed Sunday prior to the show and be divided into weight classes.
- 3. Maximum weight is 70 lbs. Overweight animals can be shown but will not be considered for Division Champion or Grand Champion.
- 4. **Bracing is not allowed.** When posing the animal, its feet must remain on the ground.
- Premium payout is based on the jackpot system using \$5/entry and the following percentages: 1st - 35%, 2nd - 25%, 3rd - 20%, 4th - 12%, 5th - 8%
- Overall Grand Champion receives rosette and \$150. Overall Reserve Grand Champion receives rosette and \$100.

Goat Shows

The Boer, Dairy, and Pygmy shows are sanctioned by IBGA, ADGA, and NPGA respectively, and their rules shall govern. Commercial (non-registered) classes are offered in the meat goat show. The Open Fiber goat show is not sanctioned.

Premiums

Premiums will be paid in the Boer and Dairy shows for 1st-5th placings (\$5, \$4, \$3, \$2, \$1). Premiums will be available after each show has concluded. Premiums must be picked up at the show; they will not be mailed.
